Warehouse Forklift Training Programs Barrie - Warehouses can either be commercial, retail or industrial facilities, functioning from product distribution services to bulk product retailing. Regardless of the type of warehouse, employees in warehouse settings must be well trained in safety measures related to material storage and handling, loading docks, conveyor systems, and pallet jacks and forklifts. Good housekeeping is vital to an orderly and safe warehouse environment.

The loading dock system is often built into the warehouse at a height from the ground making it easy to move things moving out and coming in of the warehouse. Workers would also unload and load merchandise and materials from the ramps and elevated docks. Particular attention must be paid to safety practice during this stage. To avoid falls, install yellow striping along the edge of docks and ramps. Pay attention to the area all-around delivery trucks which are parked at the loading dock, specifically the area between dock and the truck. Be certain that truck wheels are chocked when unloading.

To distribute products within the facility, some warehouses utilize a conveyor system. These systems are designed with moving wheels and belts which can pose a pinch point danger. Keep body parts and hair well away from conveyors to prevent injury. Elevated conveyors pose a hazard to personnel beneath if safety nets are absent. Employees should know how to stop conveyors in case of emergency. Be aware of the location of emergency stop buttons and off switches. When servicing conveyors, lock out/tag out measures are mandatory.

Pallet jacks and forklifts are designed to move materials around the warehouse. Forklift operators are needed to take training and receive certification. Operators of pallet jacks do not require certification, but must be trained on the machinery. Training courses instruct operators in the correct ways for hoisting objects and moving them to their assigned place. Neither forklifts nor pallet jacks must ever be utilized to lift or transport workers.

Rack system and storage shelving help to create an efficient and orderly work area if they are sturdy, braced, and allow enough room for individuals and machines to pass. Careful and slow placement of goods is needed to avoid accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles must be kept clear by keeping products flat and within the shelving units. Pallets are made use of for stacking products. They must be in good condition, and palletized products must be baled or shrink-wrapped, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (or also known as PPE) must be worn, as appropriate, to protect workers' heads, limbs, feet and hands. Hard hats or bump caps, gloves and steel-toed shoes are common PPE.

Slippery floors pocked with dents and pits present a hazard. Good housekeeping practices involve keeping warehouse floors and docks clear of debris, oil and dirt. The area must be kept clear of baling supplies, trash and boxes.
