Forklift Training Program Barrie - The lift truck is a common powered industrial vehicle which is in wide use today. They are sometimes referred to as hi los, lift trucks or jitneys. A departments store will utilize the forklift to be able to load and unload merchandise, whereas warehouses would use them to be able to stack materials and products. And grocery stores use small models to drop supplies in the aisles. Whether transporting lumber at a sawmill or loading material at a construction site, forklift operators must be trained correctly and licensed. The main concern must be on pedestrian and worker safety. This forklift training course teaches the health and safety regulations governing forklifts in order to guarantee their safe and efficient utilization.

### Forklift Training Program Safety Tips:

Proper training guarantees that forklift operators could maintain control of the lift truck in lifting, tilting and traveling. Only skilled operators must operate a forklift.

While the forklift is in use; head, arms, hands, feet and legs must be kept inside the forklift. Lift truck forks must be kept low to the ground while being slightly tilted back. Observe posted traffic signs. Honk the horn and lessen speed when taking a corner. If the driver's vision is blocked by the load, drive in reverse slowly. Pre-check the ground for possible hazards, such as wet or oily spots, objects, holes, rough patches, vehicles and people. Avoid stopping immediately.

If pedestrians pass across the vehicle or moves into a blind spot, the forklift should be stopped, the load lowered, waiting until the way is clear. If a load is being transported on an incline, the forks must be pointed uphill with a load and downhill without a load. The lift truck should only be turned around if on level ground.

Safety tips while steering - When traveling at good speeds, never turn the steering wheel sharply. Support the load using the front wheels and turn making use of the back wheels. A truck which is overloaded will be hard to steer. Follow load limitations. Do not add a counterweight in order to improve steering.

Safety guidelines while loading - The forklift's suggested load capacities must be adhered to; the information can be found on the data plate. Always make certain that the load is positioned based on the recommended load centre. The forklift will remain steady so long as the load is kept near the front wheels.

Before inserting the forks into the pallet, the mast of the forklift must be in an upright position. Level the forks before inserting them.
