Heavy stuff can fall off shelves and harm employees. Forklifts and other equipment carry inherent hazards as they manipulate heavily laden pallets. Incorrect lifting is a common source of back injuries. Even box cutters, nails and splinters could cause harm.

Depending upon the goods and materials which are being handled, the conditions of the warehouse could change from one minute to the next, specially with the equipment being used and the work being done. Due to the different possible dangers in warehouse settings, warehouse operations are regulated by many different standards. There are rules for material handling and storage, for working and walking surfaces, and regulations governing the use and selection of PPE (personal protective equipment).

Most of the safety rules covered by a company will consist of common sense regulations. Rules which warehouse staff must be quite familiar with include:

1. Safety is a priority at all times while working in a warehouse.
2. When work calls for proper PPE, like safety shoes, gloves, hard hats and eye protection, they should be worn.
3. Possible hazards should be inspected and reported.
4. Observe and Obey warning signs and signals.
5. Pay attention to the job you are doing.
6. Pay attention to the work which others are performing nearby, particularly when they are working with forklifts and other hazardous equipment.
7. Store and stack materials so that they're stable and secure.

Adherence to good housekeeping rules will help to ensure a safe warehouse for all workers. Essential housekeeping rules include keeping floors and aisles clear of things, like for instance wires and cords. Never perch items insecurely on a surface. When spills take place, clean up instantly. Dispose of garbage in correct containers. Keep sprinklers, fire exits and fire extinguishers accessible. Put box cutters and various sharp tools away immediately after use. Report tripping hazards like loose or damaged flooring.
