Forklift License Barrie - In North America, obtaining forklift certification or a forklift license involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators could obtain a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

Forklifts are powered industrial trucks which come along with various options, like for instance sit-down and stand-up. There are different types and sizes of forklift suitable for various industrial applications. Operator training courses are normally individualized to be able address the certain types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck inside a warehouse surroundings would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered forklift in a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all businesses and equipment. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to focus on detailed course requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common method for operators to be given their forklift license or certification. This particular method of certification requires the employer to provide classroom sessions and practical training on machinery within the workplace. Employers may choose to train staff on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The program incorporates lift truck operation procedures, forklift maintenance, safety procedures and company rules. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like for example hazardous materials or conditions, should be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and use each type of forklift on the worksite.

When making use of a third party trainer, the certification process will usually consist of an on-site component with hands-on practice.

Normally, a certification provided by an employer will not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Obtaining a lift truck license through employer-provided training allows the operator to run a forklift for that employer only.

The most significant factor of forklift license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one type of machine to another. Safety problems vary from employer to employer, and from industry to industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in offshore and marine operations.
